

The Department's SWAT Team continues to enhance its response capabilities through the acquisition of state-of-the-art equipment and training. The Department was able to purchase (28) Sarkar Advanced Combat Helmets (ACH) through the Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) grant program. The helmet is based on the performance requirements of the U.S. Army for ballistics, impact, retention and other protective upgrades. The (ACH) helmet was upgraded with an ARC Kit (Accessory Rail Connector). It is designed to allow SWAT operators the option of mounting a variety of mission-specific accessories to their helmets, including lights, cameras and other protective posture equipment. Each SWAT operator will have

the capability to attach an ITT PINNACLE Auto-gated PVS-14 night vision monocular. The same unit is currently issued to U.S. Special Operation Forces across the globe, the ITT PVS-14 uses PINNACLE image intensifier technology; the latest development in state-of-the-art, tactical night vision equipment.
